

What is a cookie?

We use cookies on this website. A cookie is a simple, small file that is sent with pages of this website and stored by your browser on your computer's hard drive. The information stored in it can be sent back to our servers the next time you visit us.

Use of permanent cookies

With a permanent cookie, we can recognise you when you visit our website again. This allows the website to be specially set to your preferences. We can also remember this by means of a cookie if you have given us permission to place cookies. This way you do not have to repeat your preferences each time you visit our website, which saves you time and makes it easier for you to use our website. Permanent cookies can be deleted via the settings of your browser.

Use of session cookies

With the help of a session cookie we can see which parts of the website you have viewed with this visit. This allows us to adapt our service as much as possible to the surfing behaviour of our visitors. These cookies are automatically deleted as soon as you close your web browser.

Google Analytics

Through our website, a cookie is placed by the U.S. company Google, as part of the "Analytics" service. We use this service to keep track of and receive reports on how visitors use the website. Google may provide this information to third parties if Google is legally obliged to do so, or if third parties process the information on Google's behalf. We have no influence on this. We have not allowed Google to use the obtained analytics information for other Google services. The information that Google collects is anonymized as much as possible. Your IP address is explicitly not given. The information is transferred to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google adheres to the Privacy Shield principles and is affiliated with the Privacy Shield program of the U.S. Department of Commerce. This means that there is an adequate level of protection for the processing of any personal data.

Right of access to and correction or deletion of your data

You have the right to request access to and correction or deletion of your data. In order to prevent misuse, we may ask you to identify yourself adequately. If it concerns access to personal data linked to a cookie, you must send a copy of the cookie in question. You can find this in the settings of your browser.

For what purpose and based on what basis process personal data

Displaying You processes your personal data for the following purposes:

How long we store personal data

Displaying You does not retain your personal data longer than is strictly necessary to achieve the purposes for which your data are collected.

Sharing of personal information with outsiders

Displaying You does not sell your information to third parties and will only provide your information if this is necessary for the execution of our agreement with you or to comply with a legal obligation. We enter into a processing agreement with companies that process your data on our behalf in order to ensure the same level of security and confidentiality of your data. Displaying You remains responsible for these processing operations.

Cookies, or similar techniques, we use

Displaying You only uses functional cookies and analytical cookies that do not infringe your privacy. A cookie is a small text file that is stored on your computer, tablet or smartphone the first time you visit this website. The cookies we use are necessary for the technical operation of the website and for your ease of use. They ensure that the website works properly and remember, for example, your preferred settings. They also enable us to optimise our website. You can unsubscribe from cookies by setting your Internet browser in such a way that it no longer stores cookies. See, modify, or delete data

You have the right to view, correct or delete your personal data. In addition, you have the right to withdraw your possible consent to the data processing or to object to the processing of your personal data by Displaying You and you have the right to data transfer. You can send a request for inspection, correction, deletion, data treating of your personal data or a request to withdraw your consent or objection to the processing of your personal data to info@displayingyou.nl.

To ensure that the request for inspection has been made by you, we ask that you enclose a copy of your proof of identity with the request. Make in this copy your passport photo, MRZ (machine readable zone, the strip with numbers at the bottom of the passport), passport number and Burgerservicenummer (BSN) black. This is to protect your privacy. We will respond to your request as soon as possible, but within one week.
